SHORT CV OF THE SUPERVISOR

Marco Lisi is Associate Professor in the Department of Political Studies, Nova University of Lisbon and researcher at IPRI-Nova. He has been teaching since 2007 in more than ten different Degree, Master or PhD courses (in Italian and in English) and in a number of national and international universities. He is member of the editorial board of South European Society and Politics and *Relações Internacionais* (IPRI's journal).

His research interests focus on political parties, electoral behaviour, political participation and democratic representation. During the last years he coordinated two projects on political parties and interest groups and participated in several international projects, namely MobileEU, which investigates how non-resident citizens use new digital technologies to participate in national elections. He also collaborated in several projects related to political participation, for example on the Quality of Democracy (mass survey developed at the Institute of Social Sciences) and party membership (Members and Activists of Political Parties, coordinated by Emilie van Haute).

Title: Mapping and explaining attitudes, preferences and practices towards online political participation in Portugal

Short description: This project aims to answer three main research questions: a) How do Portuguese citizens participate and engage politically through digital technologies? Are they different from their European counterparts? b) Who is willing to participate online? If such willingness exists, in which ways and why? c) Do citizens have preferences regarding which (and how) political institutions should promote opportunities for political participation in the digital era? If such preferences exist, what are they?
