PROJECT TITLE AND SHORT DESCRIPTION

MYTH AND FANTASY

Research on the connection between myth and modern fantasy. Myth plasticity and modern adaptations of traditional hero myth in modern western fantasy. Theoretical support on modern narratology.

The project has two main goals:

- 1 It aims to research how narrative both enhances cognition and, at the same time, shapes the reader's perception of "consensual reality," introduces her in a specific *weltanschauung*, that of the reader's time, but also contributes to helping to transmit and shape fundamental notions of cultural heritage embedded in myths shared by the community the reader belongs to. These aspects are particularly relevant during adolescence, the moment when the human being begins to question, renounce, and/or accept collective rules transmitted and imposed by society. Fantasy literature, because of its structure, its innate nature to subvert the rules of "reality," tends to use myths and adapt or model them to keep them meaningful to a specific *weltanschauung*, while emerging the reader in a specific fictional world, different from the actual one.
- 2 The project aims also to research how modern hero myth has been subjected to changes in the last decades, particularly in fantasy literature, precisely to:
- 1 Keep the myth alive;
- 2 Give it the necessary cultural shape to fit in a particular cultural context (Western culture);
- 3 How fantasy literature relies on tradition while aiming at innovation;
- 4 How collective cultural awareness forces the changes and what does it mean.
- 5 How the immersion in a fictional fantasy world is achieved and conditions the perception of the actual one.
