SHORT CV OF THE SUPERVISOR

Ricardo Campos holds a Graduation and Master degree in Sociology and a PhD in Visual Anthropology. He is a researcher at CICS.Nova – Interdisciplinary Centre of Social Sciences (NOVA University Lisbon), Portugal. He coordinated two research projects: Artcitizenship – Young people and the arts of citizenship: activism, participatory culture and creative practices (2019-2022), TransUrbArts - Emergent Urban Arts in Lisbon and São Paulo (2016-2020), both financed by FCT/MCTES. He is also one of the editors of the Brazilian academic journal "Cadernos de Arte e Antropologia" [Journal of Art and Anthropology] (<https://cadernosaa.revues.org/>), co-coordinator of the Visual Culture Group of the Portuguese Association of Communication Studies and co-coordinator of the Luso-Brazilian Network for the Study of Urban Arts and Interventions (RAIU).

For the last two decades, his work has centered on three primary areas of research: youth studies; arts, visual culture and media; and urban studies. His overarching focus has centered on issues of youth agency and dimensions of creativity as a fundamental element in the construction of identities and as a tool for social transformation.

PROJECT TITLE AND SHORT DESCRIPTION

The project “CombARTs: Art, creativity and new grammars of youth political participation in Portugal and Brazil” aims to explore how different youth protagonists, individually or collectively, engaged in different social, cultural and political causes, use certain resources and creative grammars as a form of political expression and participation in the public sphere. This is a particularly relevant subject of research in a period of growing extremism, populism, and crisis of political institutions. The analytical and conceptual framework draws on culturalist approaches to civic and political participation, to study civic and political engagement associated with creative processes. This project, aims to innovatively add to the literature with a transnational, interdisciplinary and ambitious research agenda, crossing the areas of youth studies, sociology of art and political studies. The transnational research involves 2 countries (Portugal and Brazil) and 4 large cities (Lisbon, Porto, São Paulo, Porto Alegre). A threefold methodological strategy will be carried-out in both countries, employing indepth interviews, case studies and netnography.
