Maria Irene Aparício (Ph.D., New University of Lisbon, 2011) Maria Irene Aparício (Ph.D., New University of Lisbon, 2011) is an assistant professor at NOVA FCSH – New University of Lisbon, and a researcher at CineLab - Laboratory of Cinema and Philosophy | Ifilnova. She obtained her PhD degree with the thesis "Light and Architecture of Space in Film: Image, Memory, and Emotion on Mind's Decade". Currently her research is focused on both contemporary cinema and arts practices. She coordinates the dissemination Program "Cinema & Philosophy in the Library" (OutLab) and the Research Group on "Cinema and Politics: Philosophical Approaches" based in CineLab. She was a researcher of the Project Film & Philosophy: Mapping an Encounter (2010-2013) (PTDC/FIL/098143/2008) coordinated by João Mário Grilo at Ifilnova. At present she is the Principal Investigator (PI) in Lisbon, of the Project "A-PLACE Linking places through networked artistic practices" (607457-CREA-1-2019-1-ES-CULT-COOP2) funded by EACEA – Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency | Creative Europe, coordinated by Leandro Madrazo (La Salle School of Architecture, Ramon Llull University, Barcelona). Her research interests include: Cinema and Philosophy (e.g. Perception, Cognition, and Film Language); Film, Ecology and Political Philosophy; Film Theory and Practices (e.g. light, space and place, time, and emotion); Artistic Practices and Art's Research (e.g. film, photography, architecture and urban landscape, video essay). The main focus are the issues of film-philosophy, art and science; film, sound, and memory, Portuguese cinema and cultural heritage as well as artistic, philosophical, ethical, historical and political problems of contemporary film, arts and visual culture. She is the section editor of Cinema: Journal of Philosophy and the Moving Image, and the editor and founder of artciencia.com, Journal of Art, Science and Communication Sciences, an on-line project since 2005.
