



EXPECTED IMPACT

CABCIN will solve a substantial gap problem in teaching quality in India by the establishment of Capacity Building Centres. These Centres are the first sustainable solution of this kind in India and are expected to contribute to innovation across regional, institutional and sectorial boundaries. The outcomes of the project will serve four target groups: academics, graduate students, prospective university members and employers. The CBC web platform is expected to generate increased interaction between key players within HEIs. But interaction between HEIs, employers and other organisations is also fostered through open workshops, and conferences by sharing experiences, know-how.

Capacity Building Centres will develop – as a result of the collaborative project activities - a repository of training solutions that will be disseminated and exploited. This is a sustainable way of supporting new teachers when they access, study and implement the innovative ideas in their context. Their newly generated solutions will enrich the already available resources, thus supporting a continuous cycle in capacity-building. The CABCIN project will be beneficial at EU level because of the good practices coming available from Indian HEIs. This will promote Indian HEIs as high-quality and innovative partners.

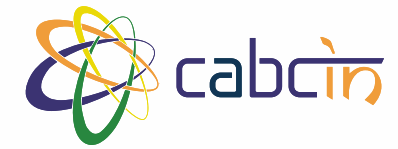


OUTCOMES OF THE PROJECT

The CABCIN project pursues three key aims: improving the quality of teaching in Indian HEIs, fostering the cooperation with EU HEIs and increasing internationalization in local HEIs. To achieve these aims, the project follows a step-by-step approach. In the first phase Indian CBC staff is trained to develop and deliver professional development for their HEI. In the second phase, EU partners define key competences to set up tailor made training for CBC staff, focusing on their didactical skills. In a third phase, CBCs are established and equipped with an e-learning platform. CABCIN partners will develop four e-learning modules – focusing on the development of the key competences - reflecting an innovative course production model, reflecting the adoption of innovative teaching strategies, while using state-of-the art ICT tools.

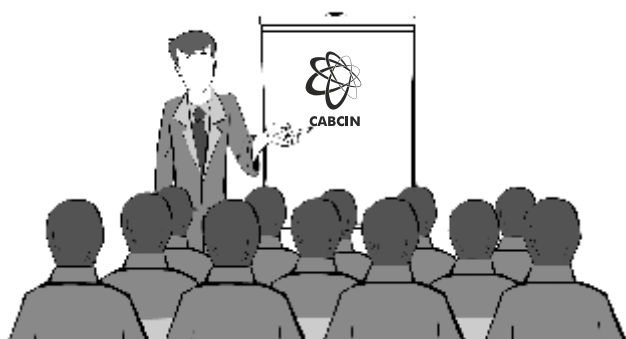


ABOUT CABCIN
