PROJECT TITLE AND SHORT DESCRIPTION

Art, Travel, Tourism, Journey, Post-Colonial, Global Mobilities, World Circulations.

A project whose objective is to map and reflect on tourist traffic from the point of view of Memory Tourism placing it within a critical discourse whose importance rests on an interdisciplinary methodological approach and research enhancing cross-border value and with a pluricontinental emphasis. As tourism is a worldwide activity with a huge impact on national GDPs, it is now a global phenomenon and transversal to a shared genealogy – colonial empires. This has acted as a catalyst for tourist flows in both directions: former colonial settlers visiting the old overseas geographies and the formerly





colonised travelling as tourists to the old imperial centre in a dual dynamic whose perspective is extremely current.

Integrated development project within contemporary postcolonial mobility.
