# SHORT CV OF THE SUPERVISOR

Catarina Fernandes Barreira is a Research Fellow in the Institute of Medieval Studies (IEM), Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities, Nova University of Lisbon, funded by national funds through the FCT, under the Norma Transitória DL 57/2016/CP1453/CT0019. Her field of specialisation is Medieval Art, and her research interests focus on Medieval Liturgy, Cistercian Order, Cistercian Monasteries; Libraries; Scriptoria; Codices (and their material study); circulation of manuscripts.

She holds a PhD in Art Sciences from the University of Lisbon (2011). Her doctoral research, undertaken as a fellow of the FCT, focused on the analysis of gargoyles within Portuguese gothic and late-gothic buildings. Thereafter, she was awarded with a Post Doctoral fellowship also sponsored by FCT: her work focussed on the illuminated manuscripts of Alcobaça in the 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> c., in a project completed in July 2017. In her research, she explored the Alcobaça library manuscripts, uncovering a previously unexplored timeline and distinguishing between external and monastery-crafted manuscripts. She also laid the foundation for ongoing investigations, innovating methodologies for analysing illuminated codices, particularly liturgical manuscripts.

Presently she is conducting investigations into the illuminated liturgical codices produced in the scriptorium of Alcobaça between the end of the 12<sup>th</sup> and the 16<sup>th</sup> c. premised on contexts of production, use (s) and circulation (in the monastery and within other Cistercian communities). She is also exploring Alcobaça's identity as a centre of book production and how it shaped other monastic communities like Lorvão.

A leading force in competitive funding enterprises, she was the Principal Investigator of the project Cistercian Horizons. Studying and characterizing a medieval scriptorium and its production. Alcobaça. Local identities and liturgical uniformity in dialogue, concluded in 2022, and financed by the FCT. Presently, she is the Principal Investigator of the project Books, ritual and space in a Cistercian nunnery. Living, praying and reading in Lorvão, 13<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup> c., also financed by the FCT.

Additionally, she supervised 2 PhD thesis(es) both funded by FCT fellowships and is currently co-supervising another PhD within the Program DEM. Co-supervised 2 MSc dissertation, and frequently publishes articles in national and international journals, and chapters in books, both as individual author and as co-author with interdisciplinary teams of researchers. She is co-editor of three peer reviewed books from leading international publishers: Loci Sepulcrales. Places of memory and burial in the Middle Ages (Brepols); An embodied religion: materialities and devotion (Peter Lang) and Cistercian Horizons. Collected essays (Trivent).





From 2015 to 2019, she led the research group Images, Texts, and Representations. Then, from 2019 to 2021, she served as Assistant Director at IEM a position to which she was re-appointed in 2023 and hold currently. She is collaborator of the Centre for the Study of Religious History, UCP, and, since 2018 that she gathers experience evaluating Post Doctoral and research projects applications within international agencies and she is member of the panel of evaluators of the following: FWO Review College, Flanders; European Commission and the evaluation panel of the Slovak Research and Development Agency (SRDA), Bratislava, Slovakia.

## PROJECT TITLE AND SHORT DESCRIPTION

Books, Rituals and Space in a Cistercian Nunnery; living, praying and reading in Lorvão, 13<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup>centuries.

This project purposes the interdisciplinary study from the beginning of the 13<sup>th</sup> to the end of the 16<sup>th</sup> centuries of a corpus of 36 illuminated liturgical codices from the library of Lorvão, the first female Cistercian





house in Portugal, as a contribution to the development of gender studies in the panorama of Portuguese monastic studies.

It is our goal to analyse this corpus, on the one hand, in material terms; that is, examining the characteristics of a codex from its illuminated decoration, pigments/inks and parchment used, to bookbinding materials and methods, including a survey of additions/alterations and state of preservation, contributing to codex and conservation history; and, on the other hand, examining ritual and content in order to identify use and circulation in the monastery, as well as the role of nuns in commissioning and in the creation/conservation of the Library. This interdisciplinary study will provide data enabling hypotheses concerning the identification of the *scriptorium/scriptoria* of origin of the codices and their particularities, as well assessing the extent to which the liturgy practiced in Lorvão under female governance presents idiosyncratic elements as opposed to conforming to Cistercian liturgical uniformity.
