PROJECT TITLE AND SHORT DESCRIPTION

Children's behavior analysis in musical-theatre pieces designed for the very young

Arts for infancy is a topic of growing interest among families and stakeholders involved in artistic programming for the very young. Several experts have highlighted the importance of exposing children to musical performances to nurture their musical development, social engagement, and well-being. However, there is a lack of objective and rigorous studies about the precise impact of an artistic performance on infants as audiences. Although there appears to be no doubt that "musicality" is a specific form of behavior that is differentiated from other aspects of human behavior in early childhood (Malloch & Trevarthen, 2008), there





still does not exist a description of musical development as systematic as that for language development, social development, cognitive development or motor development.

In Portugal, Companhia de Música Teatral (CMT) is a pioneer in musical theatrical work for infancy and has developed a substantial experience in projects in this field. The work of CMT has been presented in Portugal, Spain, Poland, Canada, USA, Belgium, Germany and Lituania and has had the regular support of the Ministry of Culture. CMT was created by Paulo Maria Rodrigues and Helena Rodrigues, with the aim to promote the dialogue between different forms of expression and to develop the production of interdisciplinary initiatives (academic infant research, artistic and technological creation) having music as a starting point.

Candidates will be able to develop ground breaking research in the area of children's behavior when presented with musical-theatre performances. Videos from previous work by CMT will be used.
