After having defended her thesis on the Office of the Circumcision from Sens Cathedral (1220-1222), Océane Boudeau has been a researcher at the Universidade Nova in Lisbon since 2015. Her work focuses on notated liturgical music in Portuguese sources and on the networks for the creation and dissemination of plainsong repertoires between southern France and the Iberian Peninsula. In 2022-23, she has been directing a collective project devoted to the choirbooks of the Hieronymite monastery of Belém (Lisbon).
