João Cancela is a political scientist and Assistant Professor at NOVA University Lisbon, where he teaches courses on democratic theory, political behaviour, and research methods. His research focuses on electoral participation, political representation, and the comparative study of democracy, with a particular emphasis on Southern Europe. He has published in journals such as *South European Society and Politics, Party Politics*, and the *Political Geography*. He is a member of the editorial board of *Relações Internacionais* and of the executive board of the Portuguese Institute of International Relations (IPRI). His current projects examine the political consequences of non-voting, the effects of participation in armed conflict on political attitudes, and the impact of natural disasters on elections.

PROJECT TITLE AND SHORT DESCRIPTION

Uneven Development and Electoral Geography: Explaining Radical Right Support in Rural Europe This project investigates how subnational disparities in human development shape political behaviour, with a focus on the rural vote for radical right parties. While existing research attributes the radical right's success





to economic stagnation or cultural backlash, this project explores a more nuanced hypothesis: that the persistence or decline of state-provided public goods — such as healthcare, education, and infrastructure — interacts with economic inequality to foster political neglect and resentment. Using Portugal as a starting case, the project will employ a mixed-methods approach to map the territorial variation of development indicators and link them to electoral outcomes. It aims to produce a typology of "left-behind" regions that moves beyond economic metrics, offering insights applicable to other European democracies experiencing similar political and territorial divides.
